Various working groups and initiatives are working to make topics such as sustainability, anti-fascism and social responsibility a stronger theme at the university and to integrate them into teaching, or are fighting for an improvement in the social situation of students. One of the organizations working on the critical study reform necessary for this is the Fachschaftsrätekonferenz (FSRK), to whose meetings everyone is cordially invited.

### Die Verfasste Studierendenschaft (VS)

### The constituted student body (VS)

All students of a university are organized in the Verfassten Studierendenschaft (VS). The organs of the VS are: \* the Student Parliament (StuPa) \* the General Student Committee (AStA) \* the Student Councils (FSR) \* the Student Council Conference (FSRK)

### Student Parliament (StuPa)

The student parliament is the highest decision-making body (organ) of the student body. All students have the right to speak and make applications there. The StuPa is elected once a year and elects the General Students' Committee (AStA) once a year. The StuPa is a place for political opinion-forming and decision-making, it commissions the AStA, decides on statutes and the budget of the student body. For the execution of elections, the student parliament elects an election committee, an arbitration committee to settle disputes, and an economic council to advise on budgetary matters.

### General Student Committee (ASTA)

The General Student Committee is the political, cultural and social lobby of all students and is elected by the StuPa. It is an administrative and spokesperson body and consists of various departments. Currently these are: Board, Finances, University Policy, Social and Economic Affairs, Public Relations, Anti-Fascism and History, Ecology & Sustainability & Health, International Affairs, Anti-Discrimination and Anti-Racism, Queer and Campus Culture. You can find more about the individual areas on the AStA homepage: http://www.asta.haw-hamburg.de/. In addition, the AStA is also a contact point for questions and problems of all kinds. In the rooms of the AStA legal advice takes place regularly. Studying, finding accommodation, finances, BAföG, legal and general advice: for this, too, it is worth

taking a look at the homepage!

Student councils, as the basic organization of the constitutional student body, are a contact point for students who are critically questioning, for problems and questions within and outside the faculty - i.e. your course of study. The doors are always open for committed students who want to exchange ideas, realize new ideas or get involved in campus life! FSRe have a great deal of influence and influence in the debate about study structures and academic content. Discussions can be organized, demos planned, films shown or parties organized. In addition, many FSRe also actively participate in the committees of academic self-administration. Just talk to your FSRe!

### Student Council Conference (FSRK)

All FSRs are organized in the FSRK. But also active and interested students are always welcome! Topics of the FSRK are currently mainly in the field of study reform - project studies, reduction of restrictions, content of seminars, reform of orientation units. But also the topics sustainability, anti-discrimination, health and underfunding are in focus. Come to it!

### Theater AG

### Fair-Teiler Bergedorf e.V. - against food waste

We are a registered association founded on the initiative of the student body. Now, professors\*, staff and students work side by side to fight against food waste on the Life Sciences Campus.

We rescue leftover food from retail outlets or weekly markets and bring it to the Fair-Divider so that all members of the association can help themselves to it. You will not find food from the trash can here. Some supermarkets participate in this project and provide the food for the platform Foodsharing (foodsharing.org) before it is thrown away. Foodsavers first receive training through the platform and have to pass a test and sample collections at the stores so that the products get here in perfect condition. There are many hygiene regulations for this; unfortunately, one of them is that the cabinets are locked.

To participate, you can simply join the association. This is of course free of charge and you also have to be an unregistered food saver. Just contact our board (**finn.ehlerding@haw-hamburg.de**) for further details.

You can then borrow a key for a 10€ deposit.



The Pfand Collection e.V. was founded in 2010 by students of HAW Hamburg. Our goal is to strengthen civic - especially student - social commitment. To this end, we collect returnable bottles in our collection garbage cans at HAW's various locations and donate the proceeds to a charitable, donation-financed institution that changes every six months. In addition, some companies regularly donate their office deposits to us. Also the Parkour Creation e.V. collects in addition industriously at the upper port in the "hall for all" around with us the ranges of the obstruction work, education work, as well as the homeless and homeless assistance to support.


